Minutes Cass County Board of Supervisors Friday, May 31, 2024

The Cass County Board of Supervisors met in special session at 9:00 a.m. in the courthouse board room with members present: Steve Baier, chair; Stephen Green, Wendy Richter, Mark O'Brien and Bernard Pettinger. Absent: none.

Richter moved, Green second, to adopt the agenda as amended. All ayes. Motion carried.

O'Brien moved, Pettinger second, to approve the May 21, 2024 minutes. All ayes. Motion carried.

At 9:04 a.m., Baier recessed for a public hearing on Proposed Amendment to the Cass County Fiscal Year 2024-2024 Budget. There were no public comments. Board members asked a few questions for clarification which Auditor Somers answered. Pettinger moved, Green seconded, to close the public hearing. All ayes. Motion carried. At 9:14 a.m., Baier closed the public hearing.

Richter moved, Green second, to approve Resolution 2024-17 Amending the Cass County Fiscal Year 2024 Budget and Appropriating the Same. Ayes: Baier, Pettinger, Green, Richter, O'Brien. Nays: None. Motion carried.

At 9:16 a.m., Baier recessed for the second public hearing to declare Emergency Medical Services (EMS) an essential service in Cass County. One member of the public spoke in support of declaring EMS an essential service stating, "we need an ambulance; it is essential." Supervisor Green stated, "people will not see an increase in taxes; this will just protect the fund so no board can take it away." Supervisor Baier explained that EMS will be a protected fund, and it will be transparent so the county will know what the budget is, and it will be different than what it is now with three funding sources; EMS will provide greater transparency. Green moved, O'Brien seconded, to close the public hearing. All ayes. Motion carried. At 9:18 a.m., Baier closed the public hearing.

O'Brien moved, Richter second, to approve Resolution 2024-16 Declaring Emergency Medical Services (EMS) an Essential Service in Cass County on the second reading. Ayes: Baier, Pettinger, Green, Richter, O'Brien. Nays: None. Motion carried.

O'Brien moved, Pettinger second, to acknowledge appointment of Sawyer Ocheltree to the Sheriff's Deputy/K9 position as of May 1, 2024, in accordance with the Collective Bargaining Agreement Wage Rate Schedule at \$35.10 per hour. All ayes. Motion carried.

O'Brien moved, Green second, to acknowledge appointment of Cameron Ward to the Sheriff's Deputy position as of May 29, 2024, in accordance with the Collective Bargaining Agreement Wage Rate Schedule at \$34.08 per hour. All ayes. Motion carried.

O'Brien moved, Pettinger second, to approve the Fiscal Year 2025 Employee Group Agreement with Secondary Roads. All ayes. Motion carried.

County Engineer Trent Wolken reported that last Thursday and Friday, secondary roads staff willingly worked to assist the Adair County secondary roads department that was in the path of the tornado that occurred on Tuesday, May 21. Cass County provided an excavator and three dump trucks, and loaded 80-100 trucks on Friday. FEMA arrived Tuesday, May 28th, so Cass County's assistance was no longer needed. Adair County is

willing to reimburse Cass County for expenses if both supervisor boards sign an agreement. All five Cass County supervisors agreed that the board chairman had the authority to sign the agreement to be reimbursed. Wolken also reported on dust control application near the Hansen Quarry and on patch work being completed along the RAGBRAI route. Chairman Baier expressed appreciation to all those who volunteered to work in Greenfield.

Richter moved, O'Brien second, to table the five-day Special Class C Retail Alcohol License for Backpocket Brewing LLC until the board has an opportunity to consider approving an ordinance relating to RAGBRAI. All ayes. Motion carried.

Pettinger moved, Green second, to approve an Iowa Retail Permit for Cigarette/Tobacco/Nicotine/Vapor for 21st Century Coop C-Store from July 1, 2024 through June 30, 2025. All ayes. Motion carried.

Richter moved, Pettinger second, to approve an Iowa Retail Permit for Cigarette/Tobacco/Nicotine/Vapor for Dollar General 20294, in Griswold, from July 1, 2024 through June 30, 2025. All ayes. Motion carried.

The board discussed updating the Cass County Comprehensive Plan for a cost of \$26,000, but did not see the value to the taxpayer. No action was taken.

Green moved, Pettinger second, to reappoint Veteran Affairs Commission Member Christine Short for a threeyear term through June 30, 2027. All ayes. Motion carried.

Committee reports: Board members reported on details about the City of Lewis' request for \$45,000 in ARPA funds to purchase an ambulance from the City of Griswold. Members also reported that an ordinance to manage RAGBRAI vendors could be placed on the June 18, 2024 board agenda. Richter reported that Boost 4 Families and other DECAT boards are merging. O'Brien and Green reported on the landfill.
